

- Measure: Enrollment and/or address confirmation at every WCC 2 to 59 months
- Track number of books returned

Testing/Innovation:

Reading House Screener

 Support the testing and development of Reading House Screener

Sustain Current Improvements/Onboard New Program Reading Interventions:

Reach Out And Read

- Maintain 90% ordered/delivered books for current volume of WCC visits per clinic
- Measure: Track number of books ordered per month to # WCC per month


•Provider/Staff Education-Training program: how both programs work and value they bring to children and families


